THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Baruch 5:1-9

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'. Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them.

Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in alory.

For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God.
And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort.

R. The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.

When the Lord delivered Zion from bondage, it seemed like a dream.

Second Reading

A reading from the letter of St. Paul to the Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11

Every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present. I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes. God knows how much I miss you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Acclamation LK 3: 4,6

Alleluia, alleluia!

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all people shall see the salvation of God. Alleluia!

Gospel

A reading from the Gospel according to Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness:
Prepare a way for the Lord,
make his paths straight.
Every valley will be filled in,
every mountain and hill be laid low,
winding ways will be straightened
and rough roads made smooth.
And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The season of Advent invites us to reflect on the profound promise of hope and transformation that God offers each of us.

In Baruch 5:1-9, we find a passage of hope and salvation directed to displaced people who suffer. Here, the ancient prophet promises hope, "for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort." This striking image reveals that God is our companion on our life journey, even in the midst of trials. It is a powerful reminder that God's presence is always with us and can turn our sorrow into celebration. God urges us to trust these promises, regardless of the circumstances.

Psalm 125 also has a message of hope. The psalmist declares that those who trust in the Lord are like Mount Zion, unshakable and enduring. Like Mount Zion, our faith becomes deeply rooted when anchored in God's steadfast love. The psalm invites us to reflect on where we place our trust.

In Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11, Paul writes to the community in Philippi from prison. Despite his circumstances, Paul's joy and peace reveal an unwavering trust in God. Difficult times do not diminish his joy or trust; instead, they draw him closer to Jesus. He shares his confidence that God, "who began this good work in you will see that it is finished." This powerful affirmation of God's faithfulness reassures us that we are not alone. We are en-

couraged to support one another, nurturing a community that reflects Christ's love and opens us to an ongoing encounter that brings healing and inspires us into action. Together, we are journeying toward the same destination — the "Day of Christ." To walk this path, we must stay close to Jesus, a disposition Pope Francis describes as "contemplating the face of Jesus." May we never lose confidence in God, who invites us to persevere in hope.

In Luke 3:1-6, we meet John the Baptist, who calls the people to prepare the way for the Lord. His message of repentance and conversion challenges us to examine our lives, clearing the paths of our hearts to welcome Christ Jesus.

John the Baptist called all who heard his message to enter the Jordan River and be immersed in its waters. This symbolic act represented their need for renewal and pointed toward the coming Saviour. Just as God brought forth creation from the chaos of the waters (Genesis 1) and led the Israelites to freedom through the parting of the Red Sea (Exodus 14:21-31), John's "baptism of repentance" called for a transformation of heart and mind, inviting believers to embrace the redemptive promises of God and prepare for the life-changing grace of Christ.

The cry of John in the wilderness resonates with urgency: "Make straight the paths." This call compels us to consider what obstacles we may need to remove — whether pride, indifference, or fear

— in order to truly encounter God. John reminds us that preparation is not merely an external act but a profound inner transformation that opens us to God's grace and mercy.

Together, these readings weave a narrative of hope, community, and preparation. They remind us that God is constantly at work, calling us from our physical, emotional, or spiritual wildernesses into the fullness of God's joy.

The season of Advent is not just about waiting. It is about actively becoming more like Christ Jesus. We are invited to nurture our faith, support one another, and clear the way for God's transformative love to enter our lives and the lives of those around us.

As we reflect on these passages, let us ask ourselves: How can we embody the joy and hope that Baruch speaks of? In what ways can we trust in God's unwavering support, like those who dwell on Mount Zion? How can we foster a community of love and encouragement, as Paul describes? And what paths in our hearts need to be made straight to truly prepare for the coming of the Lord?

In our answer lies the beginning of a new journey — one of faith, hope, and joy as we await the birth of our Saviour. May we embrace this Advent season with open hearts, ready to receive and share the love of Christ with the world.
